SUBJECT: Command Policy Memorandum #8, Dining Facility (DFAC) Rules and Dress Code

1. References:

a. TB MED 530, Occupational and Environmental Health Food Sanitation, dated 30 October 2002.

b. AR 30-22, The Army Food Program, dated 10 May 2005.

2. Purpose: To establish policy under which authorized personnel are permitted to dine in the U.S. Army Garrison, Presidio of Monterey's (USAG, POM) Appropriated Fund DFACs.

3. Applicability: This policy applies to all military, Department of Defense (DoD) civilian personnel and guests who are given approval to dine in the USAG, POM's Appropriated Fund DFACs.

4. Proponent: The proponent for this policy is the Directorate of Logistics (DOL), Food Service Division, IMWE-POM-LGS-F. This policy supersedes the previous policy dated 2 June 2010. Point of Contact is Samuel Davis, Food Program Manager, 831-242-7951, samuel.davis5@us.army.mil.

5. The following are rules applying to all patrons of the DFACs:

a. Take only what you can eat during any single meal.

b. Food or drink served in the dining facilities will not be taken out of the DFACs.

c. Food and drink served in carryout containers (Military Only) will not be consumed in the DFACs.

d. China, glass and silverware will not be removed from the DFACs.

e. Broken containers, dinnerware or food spillage will be brought to the attention of the DFAC Manager.

- f. Line jumping and saving places in the serving line will not be tolerated.
 - g. Public displays of affection: kissing, holding hands, hugging will not be tolerated.
6. The following items and activities are prohibited:
- a. Large purses, book bags, backpacks, water bottles, thermal jugs, flasks, etc.
 - b. The use of cell phones, MP3 players or any other sound producing devices.
 - c. Socializing or crowding around the cashier stations.
7. Failure to comply with established codes may be cause for denied entry and violators will be directed to leave the facility immediately. The following items and articles of clothing are prohibited in the DFACs:
- a. Torn, ragged or dirty clothing.
 - b. T-shirts designed as undergarments.
 - c. Bedroom slippers, shower shoes and flip flops.
 - d. Sleeping attire and bathrobes.
 - e. Vests, tank tops, halter tops, shirts or blouses which expose the midriff or do not cover the armpits or are made of see-through material.
 - f. Obscene patches or patches that are placed obscenely.
 - g. Hot pants, short shorts or cut-offs of any kind.
 - h. Hair curlers.
 - i. Head cover (unless carried under arms).
8. In an effort to enhance the atmosphere and proper personal hygiene in the USAG, POM's DFACs, Service Members in Physical Fitness (PT) uniforms or equivalent civilian fitness gear will not be authorized for dining in. Patrons in PT uniforms are authorized carryout services only.
