After passing both the Michigan and California Bar exams, COL (USAFR-Ret) Francis McCauley (Mac) Small, Jr. entered the U.S. Air Force as a Judge Advocate in the rank of First Lieutenant. After three years of active duty, Mac continued his affiliation with the U.S. Air Force as a Reserve Judge Advocate, retiring in 1987 as a Colonel with 28 years of service.

He has been an active participant in civic and charitable groups: Interplast, Inc., the Environmental Council of Santa Cruz County, and the South Bay Area Women's Caucus for the Arts, the Santa Cruz County Symphony Association, and Music in the Mountains.

Currently Mac serves as Project Co-Director for the **Military Retiree Conservator Corps (MRCC)**, which began in 2012 in California's Monterey County as a way to help veterans who are in need of a conservator of the person, the estate or both. The MRCC is staffed by people with significant exposure to military customs and courtesies and knowledge of veterans' benefits. They receive specific training in the field of conservatorship proceedings.
