## The Community Labyrinth Project

**Guest Speaker:** Ms. Gerre McKenna and Mr. Don Matthews, officers for The Community Labyrinth Project, will give a presentation on the use of the labyrinth in many ancient cultures and religious traditions. The labyrinth is a spiral symbol laid out on the ground or floor allowing persons to walk the pattern as a practice of prayer and meditation. Today, labyrinths are being built in churches, hospitals, schools, prisons, parks, and individual gardens for centering, meditation, and healing. A portable labyrinth will be set up as part of the presentation to demonstrate its use and offer the opportunity to those who want to walk the labyrinth.
